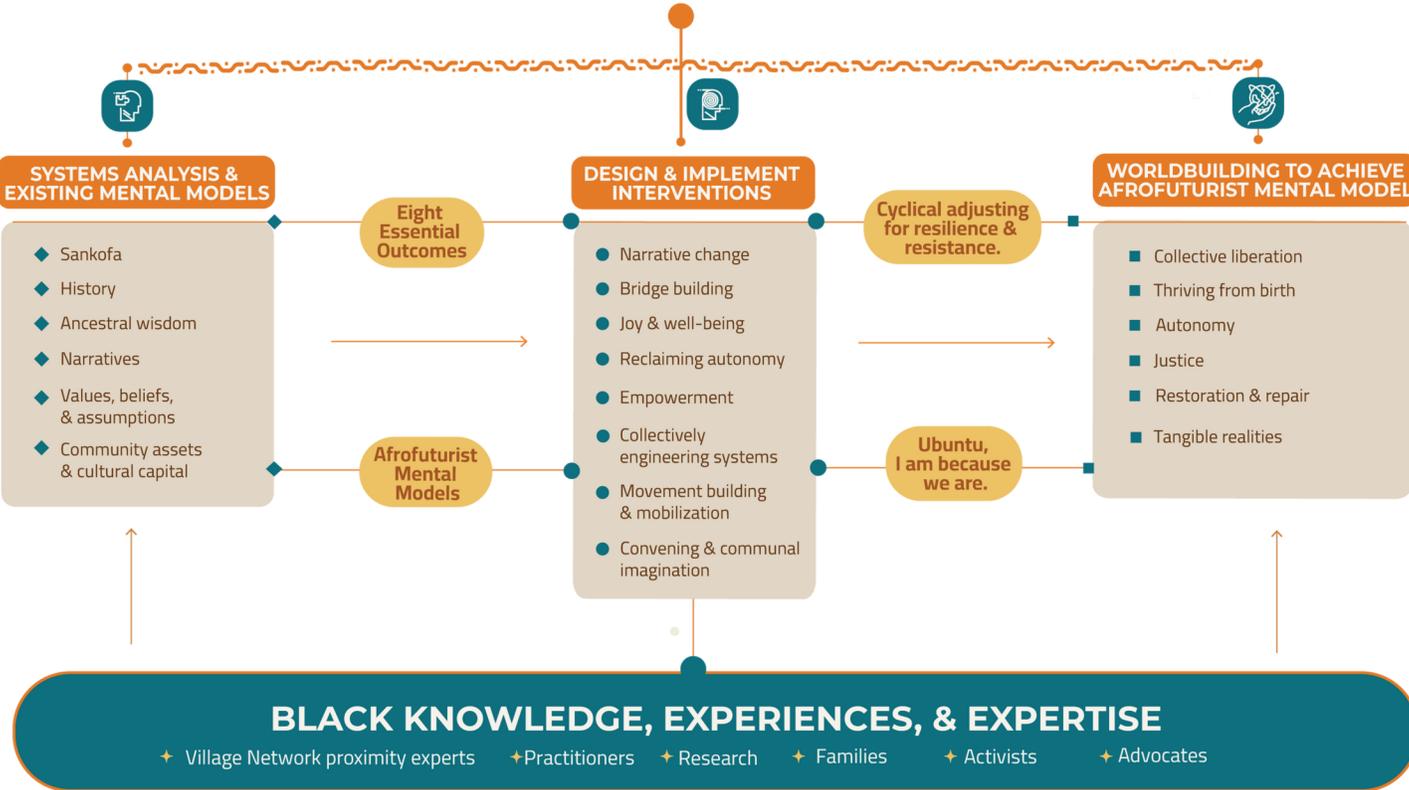


NBCDI AFROFUTURIST SYSTEMS DESIGN PROCESS

This process is created out of necessity to reclaim Black autonomy. Autonomy is required to identify and uproot existing mental models, seed new Afrofuturist mental models into society's consciousness, and collectively develop and implement policy and programmatic interventions through strategic agendas to achieve a blindingly radiant tomorrow.

AFROFUTURIST SYSTEMS DESIGN PROCESS



Focus Issue or Area:

Systems Analysis

What does the current ecosystem look like? Where does the power live? How do we study and understand the issue? What else do we need to know?

Eight Essential Outcomes

Does this approach advance the Eight Essential Outcomes?

Design Intervention

What is our role (experts, organizers, direct providers, educators, conveners, etc.) in this work? What can we do with our resources to bridge the gap between the current world and the ideal one? What are our strategies, tactics, and activities?

Cyclical Adjustment

How do we know if this approach is working? How do we adjust?

Worldbuilding

What does the ideal world look like for Black children?

Existing Mental Models

What do people currently implicitly believe about the issue and Black children? How do these beliefs reinforce the problem?

Afrofuturist Mental Models

Does this approach embed new ways of thinking?

Implement Intervention

How do we pull those levers of change? If we don't have all the resources we need to do that, how do we get those resources?

Ubuntu

Are ALL Black children, families, communities part of this?

Afrofuturist Mental Models

What do people need to believe in the new world? What do they value and prioritize?

Black Knowledge, Experiences, and Expertise Who are the Black children, families, and communities experiencing and understanding the reality of this issue? Who are the Black experts who have been studying, researching, and analyzing this issue? Who are the Black builders who have been acting on, organizing around, and creating about this issue? Who are the Black elders who have historical insight into this issue and the long arc of movement on it? **How do we hear from, learn from, elevate, and amplify the people identified above? How can we organize and mobilize Black knowledge, experience, and expertise to expand the reach and impact of our interventions?**
